# Newsletter No. 03 - November 2022

Welcome to our newsletter, which keeps you up to date with events and progress on site.

#### What's happening on site?

**Structure:** The new reinforced concrete structure at Level 18 of the Tower is being formed – you can see this poking its head above the scaffolding. In addition, the new steel and reinforced concrete structure at Level 8 of the Kingsway Block is progressing nicely.

**Façade:** The essential structural external repairs are continuing, and we have started to install the new windows to both the Tower and Kingsway Block.

**Steelwork:** The new Ground Floor and Basement infills, in the location of the former car park access ramps have been completed.

**Internal Works:** Essential structural repairs are being undertaken to the floors, repair of concrete surfaces follows the external cleaning, with removal and reinstatement of failed screeds also being carried out. Hard on the heels of this repair works, the installation of the new Mechanical and Electrical services has commenced.

**Basements:** Blockwork, waterproofing and floor repair works are well underway. This last period has seen us successfully take delivery of our first pieces of major Plant – this being some of the Air Handling Units at Basement 2.










#### What's next?

- Looking forward to Spring 2023 we will see the structural works to the top of both buildings being completed. The installation of roof plant and services will then follow.
- Blockwork internally in the Basement and forming the new lift shafts will continue and waterproofing works below ground should be complete.
- Internally the M&E service installations including ductwork, pipe work, electrical containment and security systems will continue.
- There are over 1000 windows to install in the façade - the countdown has begun!
